PLEASE READ: It is the entrant's responsibility to READ and COMPLY with the following requirements:

ELIGIBILITY, REQUIREMENTS & RESTRICTIONS:

NEW: Any awarded entry from previous RCAS shows NOT eligible.

☑Recent artwork: must be executed after 2/2006

☑Artists may qualify for two awards, (one per category). No artist may receive more than one prize in any category.

☑Artwork must be dry, framed and ready to hang with screw eyes & wires. No saw-tooth hangers accepted.

☑ Gallery-wrapped canvas will also be accepted.

☑Watercolor and other fragile media must be under Plexiglas*
*Exception -Pastel ONLY will be accepted under glass.

☑ Framed artwork height or width cannot exceed 42".

☑ Entry must be Artist's original concept personally executed.

☑Artwork must be displayed for duration of show. Winning entries shall imply release for winning piece(s) to be shown on RCAS website: www.richardson-arts.org.

☑ Items NOT for sale must be marked NFS.

No Entries from workshops or classes.

No mechanical reproduction of prints, giclees, or numbered prints will be accepted.

ONo sculpture, computer art, photographs, shadow boxes, or assemblage will be accepted.

ONo Nudes, conspicuously religious or blatantly political statements will be accepted.
